#### 1. Background

- 2 The GSSB approved the project proposal for the GRI Sector Standard Project for Textiles and
- 3 Apparel in its meeting on 10 February 2022. The GRI Standards Division prepared the Terms of
- 4 Reference for the working group and provided these to the GSSB with the project proposal in March
- 5 2023.

- 6 At its meeting on 20 July 2023, the GSSB approved 21 working group members. This document
- 7 presents the substitution of one existing member with a replacement candidate from the same
- 8 organization to the working group. The substitute candidate has confirmed their availability and
- 9 interest in participating in the working group.

### 2. Selection process and criteria

- 11 In line with the due process protocol, working group (WG) members are appointed by the GSSB and
- should reflect a balance of multi-stakeholder constituencies. The approved WG has at least one
- 13 person drawn from each constituency on which the membership of the GSSB is based: business
- enterprise, civil society, investment institution, labor, and mediating institution.
- 15 The principal criteria for selecting WG members are relevant knowledge and experience relating to
- the textiles and apparel sector and its role in sustainable development. In addition, the Standards
- 17 Division will also consider the following:
  - Adequate knowledge of the textiles and apparel sector.
- Expertise in sustainability reporting in the textiles and apparel sector.
- Expert knowledge of the impacts of the textiles and apparel sector: economic, environmental, and social.
- 22 The proposed WG member represents the civil society constituency. Following the consideration and
- 23 approval from the GSSB of this member, the final composition of the WG remains 21 candidates, with
- 24 a breakdown of the constituencies as follows:
- 25 Business enterprise: seven candidates
- Civil society: three candidates
- Investment institutions: two candidates
- Mediating institutions: seven candidates
- Labor: two candidates
